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# RecPark Mission

The San Francisco Recreation and Park Department's Mission is to provide enriching recreational activities, maintain beautiful parks and preserve the environment for the well-being of our diverse community.

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# RecPark Authorized Use Cases

- Live monitoring.
- Recording of video and images.
- Reviewing camera footage in the event of an incident.
- Providing video footage/images to law enforcement or other authorized persons following an incident or upon request.
- ***Live streaming of park activities, weather conditions, and virtual attendance to the public.***
- ***Live streaming of wildlife to the public.***
- ***Reviewing images of wildlife.***

# What are the types of cameras at RecPark?

- Security
- Community Development
- Education – Urban Wildlife Information Network
- Education – Bison Paddock

# How are **Security** cameras used at **RecPark**?

- Used for security/ safety purpose
- 300 cameras located on poles or building facades
- Live stream to the Park Rangers Headquarters
- Cameras are monitored 24/7
- Data is stored for 30 days until overwritten
- Data is shared with law enforcement
- Only Park Rangers and IT support will have access

# How are **Community Development** cameras used at **RecPark**?

- Used to promote community development and allow for virtual attendance - critical during COVID
- Camera at Dolores Park (pilot) is not currently active due to technical issues. Masking has been applied.
- Camera at Marina Yacht Harbor is a new request (recent site construction). May have masking applied.
- Live stream on public website so viewers can see activity in the parks, weather conditions, etc.
- Potentially, camera can be controlled by the viewer.
- No data will be stored
- Similar to park webcams utilized by the Golden Gate National Parks Conservancy
- Only Volunteer Managers, Park Rangers and IT support will have access

# How are **Education (UWIN)** cameras used at **RecPark**?

- Urban Wildlife Information Network is a partnership with 30+ cities. Goal is to reduce conflict btwn wildlife and people.
- Cameras are located in 18 wildlife corridors.
- Data is stored on camera's memory card. Data is uploaded periodically to UWIN database.
- Cameras are angled downwards towards a "game trail". Minimal images of people - typically feet, arms.
- Only Natural Resource Managers, Integrated Pest Managers, Park Rangers and IT support will have access

# How are **Education (Bison)** cameras used at **RecPark**?

- Used for wildlife viewing of bison
- Used to celebrate GGP 150 so may be a temporary installation
- 2 cameras located on poles in the Bison Paddock at GGP
- Masking has been applied
- Live stream to public website
- No data is stored
- Similar to webcams at the California Academy of Sciences
- Only Park Rangers and IT support will have access

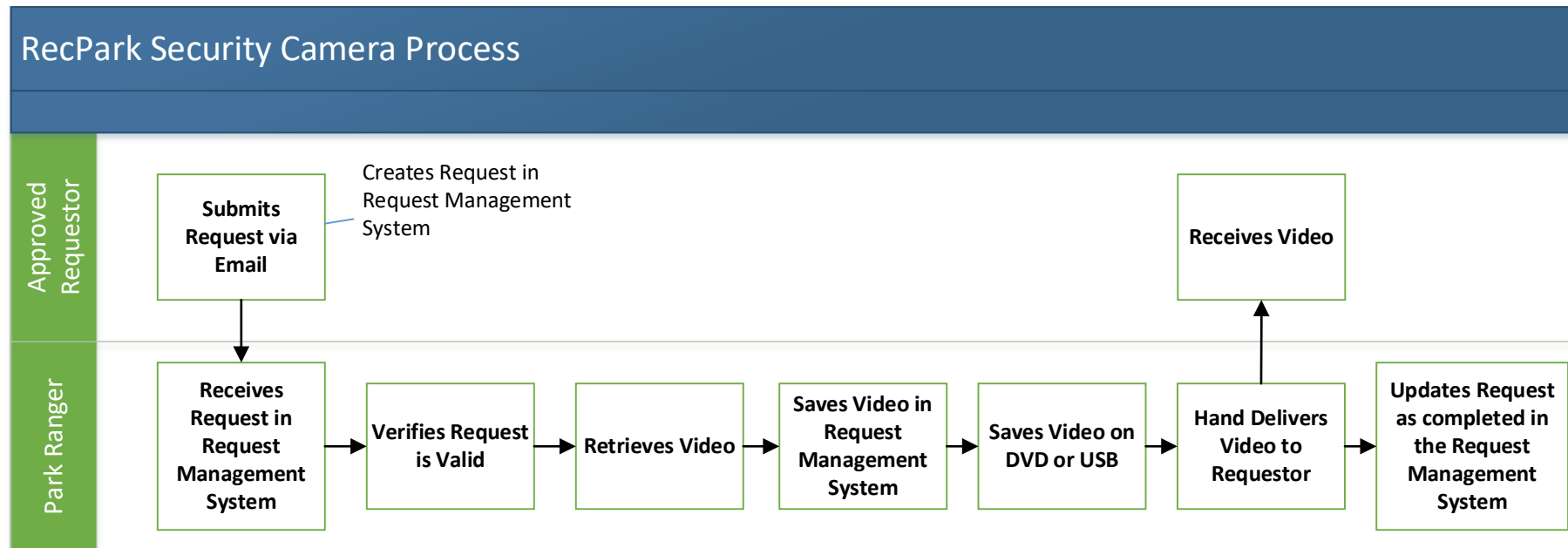
